Entry Guidelines

An Invitation to Enter

As a youth organization in Pennsylvania, you are invited to enter the PSATS Youth Awards Contest sponsored by the Pennsylvania State Association of Township Supervisors. The contest is held each year to recognize youth groups who make valuable, lasting contributions to their communities.

If your group meets the eligibility requirements and would like to be considered for an award, please express your interest to your local board of township supervisors. The board, in turn, will help you submit your entry to the president of your respective county association of township officials for his/her signature.

Purpose of Contest

The contest is designed to recognize the valuable contributions made by youth groups involved in community projects that improve the quality of life in Pennsylvania's townships of the second class and encourage greater youth involvement in township government.

Youth groups are encouraged to work with their township government to identify and address specific needs within the community.

Eligible Entrants

All officially established youth groups, such as 4-H clubs, Scout troops, school and church groups, and civic service club youth organizations from elementary school through grade 12 are eligible for the contest.

Eligible Projects

To be eligible, all projects:

- ➤ must reflect the activities of a group, rather than an individual (Eagle Scout and similar projects are eligible as long as additional youth helped complete the activity. Any prize money must go to the group, not an individual.);
- ➤ must involve youth in the planning and implementation;
- must have a major impact on townships of the second class (governed by boards of supervisors);
- ➤ must have been undertaken during the previous calendar year (multi-year, ongoing projects are also eligible provided part of the project occurred during the contest year.);
- should give the youth group members an opportunity to participate in "learning by doing" activities, increase their knowledge of township government, and develop a sense of personal and group achievement; and
- ➤ should enhance the youth group members' communication skills, understanding of the decision-making process, and citizenship responsibilities.

The Pennsylvania State University's Extension Office staff may serve in advisory roles on the project.

The following list of projects and ideas will help you determine the types of activities that are eligible for this contest. You are **not limited** to these categories, and your projects may involve more than one category.

- ➤ Park, roadside, trail cleanup projects to facilitate outdoor activity during the pandemic
- ➤ Meals/treats, acts of appreciation for health care workers, first responders, and other essential workers
- ➤ Distribution of PPE to health care, public safety personnel
- ➤ Direct services to residents of the community, such as the elderly, the underprivileged, and the disabled (e.g., shopping, yard work, etc.)
- ➤ Fund-raising projects for worthy causes in the township
- ➤ Soil and water conservation; environmental protection; recycling
- ➤ Food drives; clothing drives

Note: A single project is better than a list of activities undertaken throughout the year. Choose one or two major projects to focus on and explain in detail how it (they) benefited a township of the second class and its residents.

Nomination Procedure

All completed entry forms must be submitted to the entrant's county association of township officials for the president's signature.

Ask your local township board of supervisors to put you in touch with the president of the county association of township officials to handle the nomination. A list of county association officers and their contact information can also be found at **www.psats.org.** Find the link for "County Associations of Township Officials" at the bottom of the home page.

How to Enter

- To enter, complete the official entry form and have it signed by:
 - the youth project or activity chairman of the youth group;
 - ➤ the volunteer adult leader of the youth group; and
 - > the chairman of your township board of supervisors.
- Submit the entry form, along with documentation of the project, to the county association of township officials.

You should ask your local board of township supervisors to help put you in touch with the president of your respective county association of township officials. Be sure to submit your entry to the county association president by January 15.

The county association president will sign your entry and send it to the Pennsylvania State Association of Township Supervisors for judging. Youth groups and County Associations may also submit online at www.psats.org/psats-youth-awards.

Deadlines

Youth groups — All entrants must submit their entry to the president of the county association of township officials by **January 15.**

County associations of township officials — County associations must submit the approved entry to the State Association by **January 31.**

Awards

Four winners will be chosen from the entrants to receive:

- ➤ A framed certificate and a cash award of \$500 each. Each winner may determine the use of its cash award.
- ➤ Coverage of their winning project in an issue of the State Association's monthly magazine, the *Pennsylvania Township News*, and in their local newspapers.
- ➤ Awards will be presented at PSATS' Annual Educational Conference held during the spring in Hershey.

Judges

The PSATS Youth Award entries will be evaluated by a panel of judges consisting of representatives of the State Association's Executive Board and/or member townships.

Teamwork Experiences15 points
➤ Ability of group to identify a problem and develop a plan of action
➤ Ability of group to involve members and leaders within group to implement the plan of action

➤ Originality and creativity of group's project

Evidence of group's efforts to publicize and promote the project through local media, church bulletins, etc.
